Newark junior Ali House has dominated Section V the last two years. On Friday, she dominated New York

A year after finishing runner-up in the state competition, House jumped up that all important spot to become the girls state diving champion at Ithaca College.

House admitted she felt the nerves of trying to win a state championship leading up to the meet, but once she got in the pool, she was able to to concentrate on her dives. She said she uses something a little quirky to distract herself in between dives.

"It may sound silly but I have coloring books and listen to music until it's my turn," House said.

House led a dominating Section V performance that included the top three spots, and six of the top eight div-

ers.
"This is unprecedented. I've been going to these events for 34 years and I've never seen anything like this before," said Section V swimming coordinator Norm Schueckler.

Senior Katie Applin (Dansville) placed second and junior Erin Norton (Victor) took third.

Applin also came back this year to improve on her place in 2014.

"I finished sixth last year and I went into (states) wanting to get top three," Applin said. "I doubled up on the practices this year and the last couple weeks I felt

House said she knew her stiffest challenge would come from within her own section but the competition

"It can be pretty competitive sometimes, but it's a good competitive," said House. She also summed up Section V's day by saying, "We destroyed it today."

The swimming preliminaries were also held Friday, with the finals on Saturday at Ithaca.

Pittsford's Katie Smith broke her own state record that she set at sectionals two weeks ago in the 50-yard freestyle. She swam an automatic All-American time of 22.72 seconds. Two Pittsford relay teams recorded automatic All-American times in prelims.
